WELCOME TO THE GROVE CAMPUS

News from the Principal

Hello TRIS Families.

The first day of the 2018-2019 school year is almost here! We are very excited to join with you to support your children as they learn to navigate through life. Being only eight, nine and ten, they have a lot of learning and growing yet to do. Thank you for sharing your children with us each day!

Please help us to keep all of our students safe by reading and following the Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures below. Please leave yourself enough time in the morning so that you are not rushed. We encourage you to have your child walk to school if possible or to use Lincoln or Badger as a drop off/pick up spot.

We have signs stating: STOP, DROP, GO.

STOP: When you are along the curb

DROP: Your child should get out of the car as soon as your car is stopped

GO: Carefully pull out into the outside lane.

All students must be dropped off curbside for their safety. As you come

into the TRIS parking lot, you should be getting in the drop off/pick up line way at the back of the parking lot and waiting your turn. Please be sure to move up as other cars leave the curb. When dropping off, your child should get out quickly. Do not sit along the curb waiting with your child. Join the drop off line when your child is ready to get out. Park in the parking lot if you are going to have your child wait in the car and then walk them across to the sidewalk when it is time to go in. It is not safe to have your child do this alone.

As you finish dropping off/picking up, carefully pull away from the curb and exit around the circle. Please use caution, be polite and move slowly. You should only be in the second lane of traffic when you have completed drop off/pick up or if you are dropping off/picking up on the Levi side of the circle. Going into the second lane of traffic and then trying to pull into the drop off/pick up line closer to the front of TRIS is dangerous for you and other drivers.

The small front parking lot will be open during the day but it is only for vehicles with disabled license plates. Please do not drop off or pick up in this area unless you have a disabled license plate. It is dangerous for our families who need to use this assessible parking lot. Thank you!

Please remember that in the morning students go to the TRIS playground until 7:50am. If you are dropping off before then, drop your child off down by the playground instead of in the front of TRIS. Thank you for helping us to keep all of our students and families safe!

Please:

- drop off/pick up curb side
- allow cars out after drop off/pick up at the curb
- be respectful of each other and staff, the children are watching us

Please do not:

- park in front of the fire hydrant
- go fast
- text or talk on the phone while driving
- park in the circle
- enter the small parking lot unless you have a disabled license plate.



Hang out with us, learn with us, laugh with us, grow with us, work with us and celebrate with us!

Together we can strengthen relationships, build connections and create a learning community at Theodore Robinson that is a wonderful place to be for all staff, students and families.

Reminders to Families

- Students may be on the playground at 7:45 a.m. The bell to enter the school will ring at 7:50 a.m. and school will begin at 8:00 a.m. Students that come after 8:00 a.m. will be marked as tardy.
- Please make sure to call into the office at 882-3841 to report an absence or tardy.

Attendance

Studies have linked regular school attendance and punctuality to student achievement and success in future careers. Many times parents or guardians are unaware of the total number of days that their children have been absent or tardy. We will help you out with that. If your child has three excused absences in one semester, you will receive a letter stating that your child is close to five absences. At five, a doctor's excuse will be required, consistent with School Board policy #430. If absences or tardies are unexcused, you will be notified on that day. Five or more unexcused absences will require an attendance conference with the principal and is deemed "truancy" under Wisconsin Statutes.

Parents may excuse their children for up to ten days per year for any purpose, providing the parent/guardian submits **prior** written approval. For more details on this, please check School Board policy #430 on our website
