

### **Evansville Community School District Educational Options**

Pursuant to 2015 Wisconsin Act 55, the Evansville Community School District (ECSD) is required to notify parents and guardians of both the district's school accountability report card, as well as the educational options available to children who reside in the school district. The most recent report cards available are for the 2021-22 school year.

#### **Part-Time Open Enrollment:**

- The 2017 Wisconsin Act 59 eliminated the Course Options Program. The Course Options statute was changed to Part-time Open Enrollment. Beginning in the 2018-19 school year, a pupil enrolled in a public school in the high school grades may attend public school in a nonresident school district for the purpose of taking a course offered by the nonresident school district. ### **Early College Credit Program; Start College Now Program:**

- The 2017 Wisconsin Act 59 eliminated the Youth Options Program. The Youth Options statute (118.55) was renamed the Early College Credit Program (ECCP). The ECCP statute allows Wisconsin public and private high school students to take one or more courses at an institution of higher education for high school and/or college credit. Under this section, “institution of higher education” means an institution within the University of Wisconsin System, a tribally controlled college, or a private, nonprofit institution of higher education located in the state. Pupils that have completed 10th grade will continue to have the option to take courses at technical colleges through a separate statute, 38.12(14) under the Start College Now program.
