Social Studies

In Social Studies we recently began a new unit about the transformations that took place in America through the Industrial Revolution and immigration. We are just beginning a book unit where students had the chance to select books related to our unit and will discuss their book in class on each upcoming day three. All 6th graders should know what book they are reading and which chapters they must read for class. The books provide a wonderful lens for students to see what life was like for young immigrants, orphans, and laborers.

Most excitingly, we will soon have Immigration Day on Friday, May 10th!! Thank you so much to those of you who volunteered to help.

We do still need 5 more volunteers, so if you would like to help and are free during the morning of the 10th please email me to let me know! Students will participate in a simulation to better understand what is was like to come to America through Ellis Island. They will also be completing immigration activities in each of their classes to prepare. In Social Studies, they will be interviewing a family member to find out more about their family history and using that to create their immigrant persona. Then students will use this to create a backstory and will dress up like them and assume their identity for Immigration Day. Thank you so much for helping your child find out what they can about your family's history!



Language Arts

Students recently completed a literary essay based on a character from

their selected short story and will now begin working on an essay based on theme. Mr. Langan's class will begin reading Immigration themed books, while Mrs. Smith's class will be starting their book clubs on Civil Rights. Adventure/ Fantasy book clubs will continue in May.

Our final writing project of the year will be for students to

write, illustrate and share their own **Children's Book**. Students may purchase a hard cover "Bare Book" for \$3.00. These make wonderful keepsake gifts for Mother's/ Father's Day. *Please send your* money in by May 1st so we can get them ordered ASAP. Students who complete their project on time will be able to join their class on a walk over to Levi-Leonard where we will share our final products with 2nd grade classes at the end of May or start of June. Students will also be visiting and touring our newly expanded Eager Free Public Library this spring. They will complete a scavenger hunt and learn about some exciting programs that will take place this summer. Math

Regular math classes are beginning Chapter 9 of BIG IDEAS. Chapter 9 is the study of mean, median and mode,

along with mean absolute deviation. Students will be using mean to find the MAD. We will also look at which measures work best with different situations. Chapter 10 will be all about data. Stem and leaf plots, histograms and box and whisker plots will be explored. Ask your child if they have done any math extra credit from their packet. Check out my YouTube lessons for extra practice or help on math

skills. Calculators will be used in this chapter!

Advanced math students will be working with a formula unit in Chapter 9 of BIG IDEAS. Students will be working with the formulas for surface area and volume of prisms and pyra-mids. Math

Students will be starting a unit on circles and area. We will be studying the number pi and how to find area and circumference of a circle. We will also be finding the area and perimeter of composite figures, including semi-circles.

Compositon/Literature

We are currently in the middle of our medieval unit. Students have selected one of six medieval books to read. They each have a calendar with reading assignments through the beginning of May. For writing, we have been working on poetry. These poems, along with all of their other writing, will be included in their individual books of writing. Look for these books of writing to come home at the end of the school year. We will finish the year by reading one final book, *The Outsiders* by S.E. Hinton.

Science

We are finishing our genetics unit and will end the year with some ecology and, if time, nervous system. A reminder that science projects will be due May 16th. Students have been excited to get emails from *real* scientists.

Computer Applications

Students are busy learning all the details of Microsoft Word 2016. Our focus is to provide tools in both Microsoft and Google Suites that they will be able to use for school and workplace applications. Students are completing mini projects using these tools so you will see many assignments in Skyward for this unit. Upcoming: Updating our Middle School Portfolio using Google Sites!

Spanish

Students in 7th grade Spanish are continuing our food unit. Students will create and present a conversation using food vocabulary. Students will also also be working on a Spanish review project called HABLO. Students will complete the HABLO speaking activities during class time. Students are reading novels about Hispanic people and cultures for our Spanish Reading Workshop unit. Student should read two different novels by the end of May. They will be recording their thinking as they read in a reading workshop notebook.

8th Grade News

Composition/Literature

8th graders will be studying WWII and the Holocaust the last month of school. During this unit, they will learn about the era and be reading books that are based on the time frame. They will get to know their characters and the choices they make to survive. Students will also be focusing on inferencing and change in character.

Science

Our next unit in science will be the Study of Water, including the water molecule, fresh and salt water, Earth's rivers, lakes, oceans and seas. 78% of the planet is covered by either liquid water or ice, and right now the ice part is melting pretty fast.

Spanish

Students in 8th grade Spanish will be learning parts of the body for their final unit. They will be able to express health concerns, which is a valuable skill when traveling of course. In addition, each student will make a beginning Spanish book for a 1st grader in our district!

World Geography

Students in World Geo 8 will be traveling to Europe and Asia studying places, cultures, history and issues this April and May.

Math 8

In May, students will be getting to work with all things linear to prepare for the fall. They will interpret, write, and graph linear equations and solve linear systems.

Algebra

For the Algebra class, we'll finish up the year in a radical way...with square roots, cube roots, and radical functions.

Tech Ed

Students will finish the robotics unit with coding and programming. Then, they will be using a CADD program called Inventor to create online three-dimensional scale models.
